Take Public Health: The Way We Live, Work, and Play in Spain this Summer

Public Health: The Way We Live, Work and Play is designed to help students think about contemporary health issues from an interdisciplinary perspective.

The course includes an introduction to the five core areas of public health – biostatistics, epidemiology, environmental health, health services administration, and social and behavioral sciences – and how these areas relate to various health, health care, and human service professions.

Public health helps inform decisions that shape the behavior of individuals and communities. Students will analyze health issues such as health promotion, disease prevention, and health care policy from a variety of perspectives. As part of the course, students will work in small interdisciplinary teams to access and evaluate information about a particular individual or population-health issue, and learn to argue persuasively, both orally and in writing, for interdisciplinary approaches to that health issue.

The focus of the course is to engage students' curiosity about how the discipline of public health and interdisciplinary approaches apply to issues students may confront in their future professional work.
