<i>I would like to fulfill GenEd requirements while abroad.</i>	<p>Temple students who successfully complete (with a C- or better) credit-bearing coursework worth at least three semester hours in an approved summer or semester study abroad program with a minimum stay abroad of 28-days will satisfy the World Society (GG) requirement.</p> <p>In addition, Temple Rome and Temple Japan offer several GenEd courses each semester.</p>	<p>Temple students who successfully complete (with a C- or better) credit-bearing coursework worth at least three semester hours in an approved summer or semester study abroad program with a minimum stay abroad of 28-days will satisfy the World Society (GG) requirement.</p> <p>Some appropriate external program courses may fulfill GenEd requirements. GenEd requirements which are most commonly found abroad include Arts, Human Behavior, Race and Diversity, and Science and Technology. As part of Temple’s External Study Abroad Approval process, GenEds, like all external courses, must be evaluated and pre-approved. Per university policy, Intellectual Heritage courses cannot be transferred back to Temple and therefore cannot be taken abroad on external programs.</p>
