<p><i>I would like to fulfill GenEd requirements while abroad.</i></p>	<p>Students who successfully complete (with a C- or better) credit-bearing coursework worth at least three semester hours in a Temple summer or semester study abroad program with a minimum stay abroad of 28-days will satisfy the World Society (GG) requirement.</p> <p>In addition, some summer faculty-led programs may offer GenEd courses, and Temple Rome and Temple Japan offer several GenEd courses each semester and in the summer.</p>	<p>Students who successfully complete (with a C- or better) credit-bearing coursework worth at least three semester hours in an approved external summer or semester study abroad program with a minimum stay abroad of 28-days will satisfy the World Society (GG) requirement</p> <p>Some appropriate external program courses may fulfill GenEd requirements. GenEd requirements which are most commonly found abroad include Arts, Human Behavior, and Race and Diversity. As part of Temple’s External Study Abroad Approval process, GenEds, like all external courses, must be evaluated and pre-approved.</p>
